OUR ACHIEVEMENTS

Here are some examples of the important work that has been done:

- Completed Site Readiness grant which resulted in a \$75,000 grant for the industrial park to complete the gas line.
- Assisted a manufacturing company with an MEDC Grant to purchase equipment.
- Continue to partner with organizations like U.P. Michigan Works! and WUPPDR to provide services to Baraga County.
- Led the implementation of the MEDC's Restart Grant Program assisting 26 companies in Baraga County, with 20 receiving awards totaling \$120,753.
- Led the MEDC's Survival Grant Program assisting 18 companies, with 17 receiving awards totaling \$66,500 in Baraga County.
- Created web based business resource guides.
- Participate in housing and childcare tasks forces to provide solutions for the business community.
- Support and assist businesses from start up to succession planning (as shown in the 'Number of Clients' chart on next page)
- Send two site selector email blasts annually with available properties in Baraga County to list of over 800 site selectors.
- The L'Anse Area Community Development Corporation (CDC) was created through a Rural Readiness Grant awarded to WUPPDR. The BCEDC was a key partner in securing this grant, and several BCEDC board members are actively involved on the CDC board.
- Implementation of webinar series to provide valuable information to Baraga County on items like success planning, protecting your business from theft, and economic development tools for businesses
